
Paper Boy Giving My Heart To Journalism





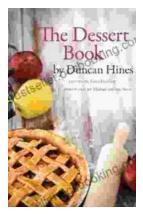
